### The Inalienable Right to Change Your Mind

It's not that this country started out perfect, or even that it started out right. There was a lot that wasn't right when it started. For example, African-Amermost icans and many Native Americans were slaves, while women had few rights and couldn't vote. Who would say that such things are right? In fact, in many places only property owners could vote --it wasn't even enough to be a white male, if you happened to be broke. Declaring that "all Men are created equal" in the Declaration of Independence didn't, in fact, give all equal opportunity, or even equal freedom under the law. It was, howev-er, a good "aspirational idea" -and people noticed.

Still, this new gov-ernment recognized that "all men ...are en-dowed by their Creator with certain inalien-able rights." A few of these rights were vaguely listed, such as: "Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness. So, why was the major portion of the popula-tion deprived of these Divine rights? I have a strong hunch that few people even realized the inequality. That's the way it is --we rare-ly notice what's wrong with the things we take for granted. After all, we're good, wellmeaning people, aren't we?

Perhaps the most valued of all American rights is the inalienable right to change our minds. Without that one right, we would have been stuck at the starting gate. Up until now, we Ameri-cans have known how to change our minds. We don't always see where we are wrong; but, when we do, we reserve the right to change our minds. When I started in my first ministry, the then Governor of Ala-bama, George C. Wallace, (1968 presidential candidate, receiving 46 electoral votes and nearly 10 million popular votes) was an avowed racist. When he died on September 13, 1998, few would have recognized that old George Wallace; he had become a soft-spoken man who was not a racist and had many African-American friends. Why? George Wallace changed his mind --said he was

wrong back then and sorry for what he did.

Robert McNamara was Secretary of Defense from 1961 to 1968. If you read his book on the Vietnam War, you will find that he changed his that mind about Vietnam. more informa-As came in, Colin tion Powell changed his mind about Iraq having "weapons of mass destruction." When things become more clear, we have a duty to "change our minds."

We complain about politicians when they change their minds. We say that they wimp out, waffle, vacillate, flip-flop, and aren't to be trusted. Yet, would anyone really want to elect a person who could not collect additional information, give up preju-dices, rethink things and change his or her mind? We even criticize politicians when they change their minds to agree with us --I'd think we would be delighted! But, no; somehow, it is evil to change our minds.

Think about it; we're all born knowing absolutely noth-We still don't ing. know much. The only safeguard we have is the right to change our

minds. Many mental health treatments are built upon the idea of changing the way we The cornerthink. stone of Christianity has always been the word repentance, which is derived from two Greek words, meta (to change) and noia (mind). I feel reasonably safe so long as I retain my inalienable right to change my mind. You see, like George Wallace, Colin Powell, and Robert McNamara, I feel quite certain that I might still be wrong about some things. In fact, for me, the most dangerous politician is the one who is too proud to change his or her mind. For Heaven's sake, anyone ought to know that the only person who doesn't need to change his mind is God, himself. Yes, even Christianity itself cannot exist in anv reasonable. reconciling fashion without the right to say, "I'm sorry, I was wrong."

## Think about this by Eric Smith

"I tell you this so that no one may deceive you bv fine-sounding arguments. For though I am absent from you in body, I am pres-ent with you in spirit and delight to see how orderly you are and how firm your faith in Christ is." Colossians 2:4-5, New International Version. Paul has shown the supremacy of Christ and how he has labored for the Church. He has shown the mystery which was hidden, now revealed; to be Jesus Christ. Also. after showing his concern for their relationship with Jesus Christ, Paul warns them of the threats they will face. When you understand fully what the previous verses revealed about Christ, you will understand the warning Paul is giving in these verses and the rest of the letter. "I tell you this so that no one may deceive you by fine-sounding arguments." One of the ways in which Christians could be deceived is **"by fine-sounding** arguments". The Greek word translated "deceive" or "delude" is the idea of being false or of being led into false teachings. "fine-sounding arguments" is the kind of language lawyers used to convince the jury an individual is innocent when they are guilty. Paul is saying to the Colossians and therefore, to all Chris-tians if what sounds like it is possible and yet it does not agree with what the Scripture teachings, then it is false teaching contrary to what the Lord taught. Just remember what Wilbur Fields wrote in "Philippians-Colossians-Philemon," "There are glib tongues advocating every imaginable religious idea. Many people are misled by eloquent speech." Every Christian needs to be like the Bereans as recorded in Acts 17:11, "Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scripture every day to see if





what Paul said was true". If you follow what the Bereans did 111 searching out the truth, and then obey the truth you will be on your way to being with Jesus. "For though I am absent from you in body, I am present with you in spirit." Remember, Paul was in prison in Rome when he wrote this letter and therefore, was not able at that time to visit the Colossians. Just because he was not able to be there physically does not mean he did not care for them. Paul always prayed for each congregation that he knew about. Every letter Paul wrote has one or more prayers in it or refers to his praying for them. The welfare of the Churches was constantly on Paul's mind. Paul "delight to see how orderly you are and how firm your faith in Christ is." Any minister is delighted when he hears they are doing well in their walk with the Lord Jesus Christ. The Colossians were firmly established in their walk with Christ. They knew the truth and were being faithful to Jesus Christ. They were continually growing in their relationship with Jesus Christ and therefore, would not give in to the false teachings which came their way. How is your walk with Jesus Christ? Are you being faithful to the truth revealed in the Scripture? Search the Scripture to know the truth and then obey it. THINK ABOUT HOW FIRM YOUR FAITH IN CHRIST IS AND THEN, STRIVE TO BE MORE FAITHFUL IN YOUR RELATION-SHIP WITH JESUS!!!
